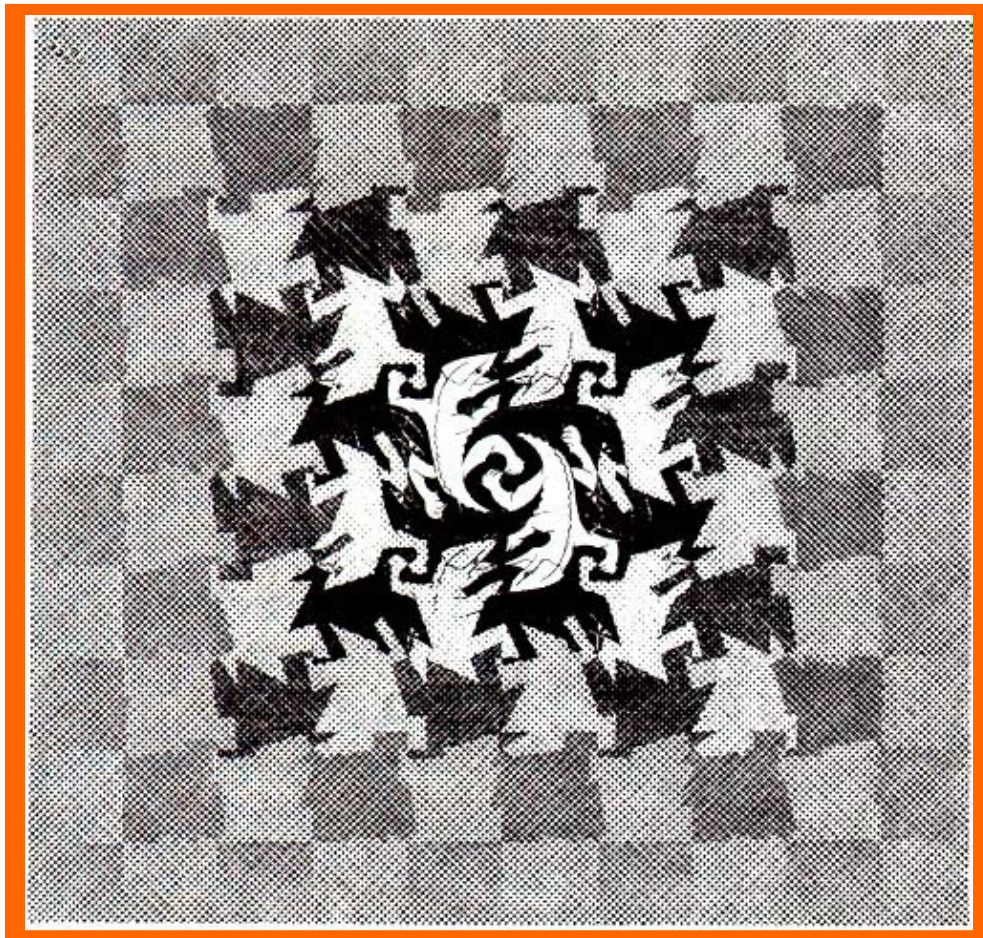

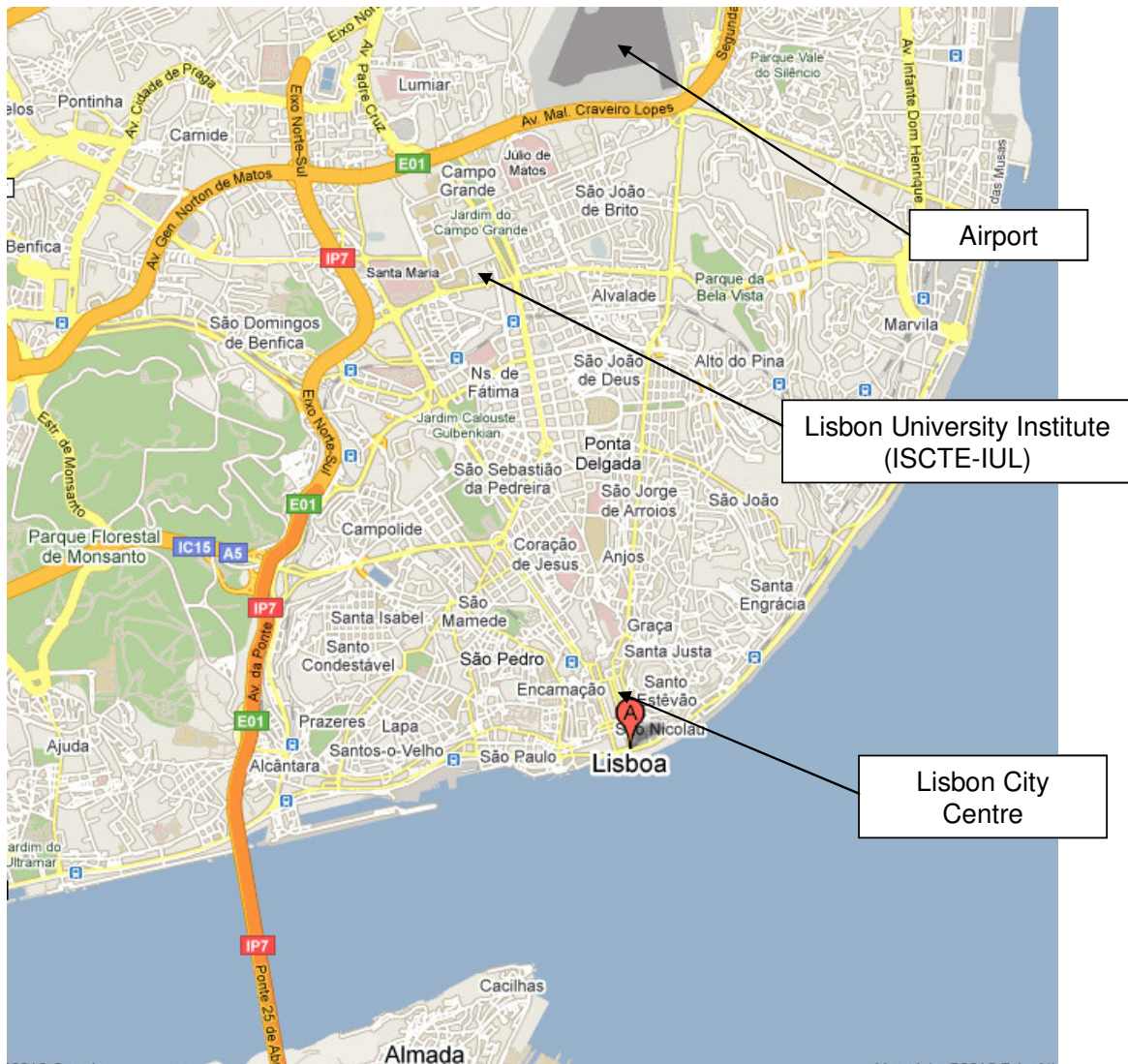

Directions

Metro: From ISCTE-IUL to the city centre (and vice versa) is easiest by taking the Yellow Metro line and change at the stop Marques de Pombal to the Blue line. At ISCTE-IUL you go to the metro "Entre Campus" and take the Yellow Line (Linha Amarela) direction "Rato". Change at Marques de Pombal to the Blue line (Linha Azul) direction "Sta Apolonia". Take the exit Restauradores or Baixa Chiado. You can also walk (15 minutes) from Marques de Pombal to the city centre. A one-way ticket costs 0,80 EURO.

Bus: Lines 44 and 745 go from the city centre (Rossio square) via Entre Campus. Line 732 goes from the city centre directly via ISCTE-IUL. From the airport you can take the 44 and 745 bus which connect the Airport and city centre and drive by Entre Campus (one-way tickets are EUR 1,40). There is also an AIRPORT bus which goes the same route as 44 and 745 (EUR 5,00).

Taxi: A price of a taxi from airport to the city centre is about 11 EUR. Within the city centre prizes range from 5-10 EUR. At the airport you can buy Taxi vouchers to make sure you do not pay too much (some cab drivers like to take detours).
